Talking Point by Team Vicar Revd Claire Wren

If you were asked to choose your favourite thing about Autumn, I wonder what it would be? It is a feast for the senses: taste the soup, smell the bonfires, hear the wind (and the rain), feel the embrace of your favourite jumper and allow the swirling palette of the falling leaves to lift your mood with mustard yellows, berry reds and pumpkin oranges vying for your attention.



It is a marvel that in dying, leaves turn from green and pass through all shades before becoming a crunchy brown carpet only to be slowly subsumed back into the soil. It is an extravagant, and seemingly wholly unnecessary, display of beauty. Like a confetti cannon announcing the finale, the curtain comes down on summer in a blaze of glory.

As the season shifts, we move into a time of more darkness than daylight. There is a sense of creation furling in on itself to conserve heat, putting itself to bed in preparation for winter, allowing itself to rest, recharge and rehearse for the show of Spring.

Resting is part of the process. It is neither fruitless nor wasteful. The trees are wise in their resting. They shed their extraneous leaves; short days and weaker light make photosynthesis inefficient. Hanging onto leaves would prove disastrous as breezes stiffen to gales. Studies have shown, however, that the roots continue to grow. While the rest of the tree is dormant, roots are storing up carbohydrates and nitrogen-rich substances. And so, when the tree reawakens, it has nourishment for leaves to bud and new shoots to grow.

There is much wisdom to be gained from trees. Aside from God and humans, they are the most frequently mentioned living things in the Bible. Trees are the pinnacle of the plant world, perfectly in step with the seasons. Anchored to the earth, and reaching to the sky. Providing shelter and food for countless other species.

I invite each of us to consider this wisdom. What are we going to shed this Autumn? What are we going to focus our energies on? This season is one of preparation, for ourselves and for the earth. Leaning into what is important, letting go of what is not. In short, 'Be more tree'

But blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord...They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit.

Sunday 25th October 2026- The Blake Event - 7.00pm

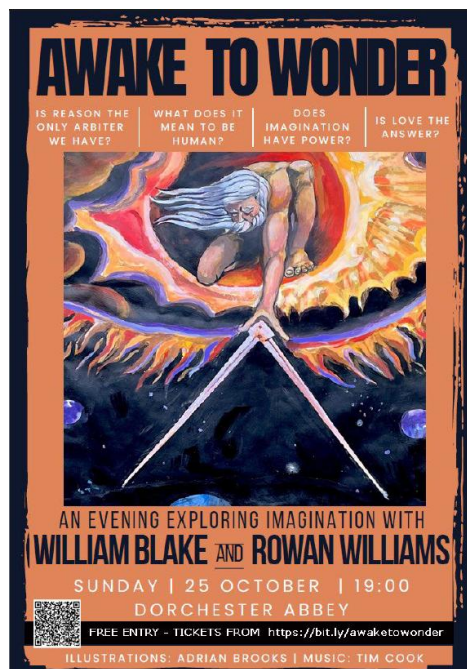
'Awake to Wonder' – an evening of lively conversation with William Blake and +Rowan Williams.

Summary of Culham Parish Council Meeting

Held on 9 September 2026

The Parish Council met on 9 September at Culham Nursery & Pre-school, with nine members of the public attending.

Proposed Oxfordshire Reservoir

The meeting began with a presentation from Deborah Bennett, Secretary of GARD, on the proposed reservoir and its potential impact on Culham. Particular concerns included construction traffic, environmental impacts and the consequences of a potential emergency drawdown.

A public consultation concerning traffic and construction impacts was announced on 9 September. Residents are encouraged to register with the Planning Inspectorate for project updates. Later in the Development Consent Order process, residents will also be able to register as Interested Parties, make representations and potentially participate in hearings. Further information is available from GARD.

Issues Raised by Residents

A number of local matters were raised during public participation.

After many years maintaining **culhamvillage.org.uk**, its current administrator is looking for someone to take over the website. Several residents expressed an interest in helping preserve this valuable record of Culham and its history.

Overgrown vegetation along **Tollgate Road and parts of the A415** was also raised. A volunteer clearing and litter-picking morning will take place on **Saturday 3 October**. Further details will be shared through *The Mouthpiece* and Village Chat.

Residents raised concerns about **HGV traffic using Sutton Courtenay Bridge**, including speeding and several HGVs crossing together. The Parish Council will raise these concerns with Highways and investigate whether HGV traffic can be restricted, particularly given concerns about the impact on the bridge structure.

The Council also agreed in principle to make previous **village speed survey results** publicly available.

Community Orchard

The Parish Council agreed to proceed with purchasing trees and implementing the planting plan for the Community Orchard this autumn.

Village Pavilion

There continues to be support within the village for the proposed **new pavilion/community facility**. The Parish Council will now consider the feedback received, although the final location and details of the project remain to be determined.

Recreation Ground & Trees

The Council agreed to prioritise tree maintenance identified in the recent **Tree Survey**. Councillors will also review the Recreation Ground lease.

High Lodge Farm

The Parish Council discussed the recent planning application for **a dog walking field at High Lodge Farm**. Following the discussion, the Parish Council will be submitting a formal response to the planning application.

Local Government Reorganisation

County Councillor Robin Jones provided an update from Oxfordshire County Council. Of particular note was the **pause in the reorganisation of local government**.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Wednesday 14 October 2026 at Culham Nursery & Pre-school**.

Local Government Reorganisation PAUSED

Hot on the heels of the 16th July parliament announcement that Oxfordshire and West Berkshire's seven existing councils will be replaced by three unitary councils from 1 April 2028 as part of its plans for local government reorganisation (LGR), Angela Rayner said on Monday 7th September that the process will now be put on pause as she seeks legal advice around procedure. The govt is still minded to proceed with LGR but there is currently no indication as to timeline. Elections that are normally expected will continue according to current boundaries. For now!

Oxford congestion charge

From 28th Sept 2026, six new traffic filters will replace Oxford's temporary congestion charge. This will follow the planned reopening of Botley Road on 20 September. Any Oxfordshire resident can apply for a permit allowing up to 25 free day passes through the new traffic filters. If you already have a congestion charge permit it will automatically transfer to the traffic filters. Additional permits are available for many groups, including Blue Badge holders, unpaid carers, community health and care workers, mobile traders and patients who need frequent hospital appointments in the Oxford area.

Green Motion at Council Passed Unanimously

OCC Green Councillors brought a motion on Housing development road and infrastructure adoption to the Full County Council meeting on Tues 8th Sept which received cross-party support and was carried unanimously. It recommended stricter requirements for timelines for road, drainage, pavement and verge adoption to prevent residents being left without recourse with deteriorating roads.

White Horse Reservoir

A space for nature, a place for people

Summer 2026 was officially declared the hottest on record according to official Met Office reports. Gardens turned brown, rivers came under pressure, and water demand across the Thames Valley reached record levels.

While recent rain has been welcome, rivers, groundwater, and water supplies take time to recover after prolonged dry weather. As our climate changes, we need to be able to store more water when it's plentiful so there is enough when it's needed most.

That's why White Horse Reservoir is such an important project: helping to secure water supplies across the South East while reducing pressure on rivers, chalk streams and groundwater sources.

Plans continue to be developed with input from local communities, and a planning application is due to be submitted later this year.

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Message from Matthew Barber, Police and Crime Commissioner

Waste crime knows no boundaries

We have seen the huge impact of large-scale waste crime here on our doorstep with the massive illegal dump near Kidlington which has cost the Environment Agency millions of pounds to clear up. More arrests have already been made in this case and the investigation into others continues.

It is not just these huge waste sites that are the problem though. Each year across the country there are over a million incidents of fly-tipping and many of these have serious consequences for victims. Often landowners, large and small, are left with the clean-up costs and the problem of disposing of someone else's waste.

In Oxfordshire the problem has only been exacerbated by the changes made to our local tips. The County Council's new policy for our local household waste recycling centres is making it harder for many residents to legitimately get rid of their waste, and that can play into the hand of organised criminals.

Thames Valley Police regularly work with local authorities and with the Environment Agency on joint operations to tackle waste criminals. Sometimes operating as seemingly legitimate businesses - some even have waste carrier licenses - these criminals are not just responsible for fly-tipping but are often linked to other forms of organised crime.

They operate across borders, and so must the enforcement. Thames Valley Police's Rural Crime Taskforce frequently operates in London and neighbouring counties to identify and apprehend those responsible for fly-tipping, rural crime and other offending locally across Oxfordshire.

The impact of fly-tipping can be significant. It is not just an inconvenience but can land the victim with a bill for thousands of pounds to safely remove someone else's waste. In the coming months I hope to be able to announce a pilot project across Vale of White Horse and South Oxfordshire that will allow victims to claim support to deal with some of the costs of the clear up.

This will help victims financially as well as helping to protect our local environment. The intention of the scheme is to increase reporting of fly-tipping incidents and increase the chance of catching those responsible.

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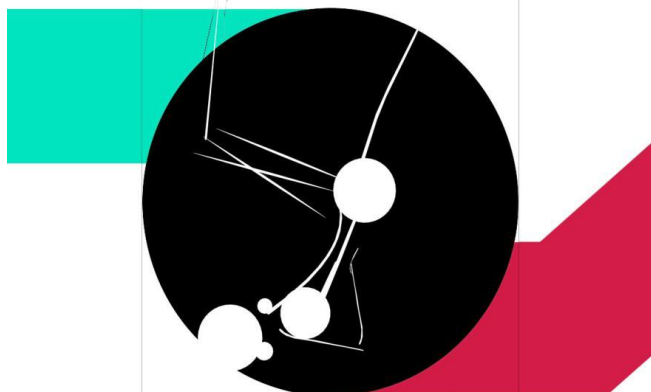
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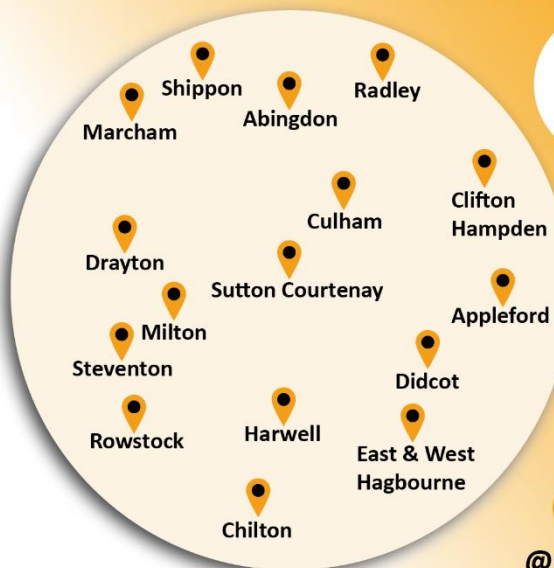


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
